About the Anti-Hunger Corps Summer Associate program:

The Anti-Hunger Corps (AHC) is an AmeriCorps VISTA project sponsored by Hunger Free America. This national project operates two programs, one for a full-year and the other for just the summer, called the Summer Associate program. Both the full-year and Summer Associates work in both rural and urban areas across the country as part of a public-private partnership to improve access to the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP, formerly Food Stamps), the Summer Food Service Program, and other anti-hunger programs for Americans in need.

About Florida Impact to End Hunger:

Florida Impact to End Hunger is dedicated to advancing health equity by ending hunger for all Floridians. We mobilize communities to maximize access to federal, state, and local food and nutrition programs with a focus on Florida's most vulnerable populations. Since 1979, Florida Impact has helped community leaders secure more responsive public programs and policies to address hunger. This focus has led to the statewide establishment of the School Breakfast Program when school is in; and the After School Meal (AMP) and Summer Food Service (SFSP) programs, when school is out. Position Description:

Florida Impact to End Hunger in partnership with Hunger Free America is seeking Summer Associate members to facilitate operations and partnerships around the Summer Food Service Program (Summer BreakSpot) in Southeast Florida. Fellows will be responsible for daily activities in support of the program, including:

- Assisting in summer meal distribution (grab and go/delivery)
- Producing summer program virtual and in-person (where feasible) activities to support continued education and physical activity during the summer.
- Creating and distributing promotional materials to encourage participation
- Communicating with meal sponsors, sites, and other community stakeholders to promote the program
- Evaluating program successes, challenges, and opportunities

Candidates must be able to provide their own reliable transportation to, from, and between food service sites throughout Miami-Dade and Broward Counties.

Time Commitment:

This is a short-term, 10-week, full-time position beginning June 7, 2021 and ending August 16, 2021. You are expected to be available for the needs of your community and project at all times, including days, nights and weekends. AmeriCorps VISTA service requires a full immersion in the project and community; therefore, full-time employment with other entities is strictly prohibited. Summer Associates may be able to have a part-time job outside of VISTA service, however, they will discuss this with their supervisor prior to starting their position. Also, AmeriCorps VISTA and Summer Associates must adhere to some restrictions on political and religious activities. You are responsible for finding your own housing. No housing allowance will be provided.

Qualifications:

In order to qualify for the position, you must be 18 years or older (no upper age limit). Members must also hold one of the following citizenship or legal residency statuses: US citizen, US National, Lawful Permanent Resident (i.e. Green Card status), and persons legally residing within a state. Examples of persons legally residing within a state may include those holding the following classifications: refugee, asylee, temporary protected status throughout VISTA service, and holding Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) status.
